

Signature Heritage Events and Programs

Annual Heritage Gala – The Heritage Gala is a semi-formal celebration filled with fun, food, collaboration, music and dancing in recognition of sponsorships and community support.

<u>Groove City Culture Fest</u> – This 2-day weekend event is the heart and soul of the Pine Street Community. The Groove City Culture Fest is more than just a music featuring national and local entertainment, it also includes health and wellness vendors, educational opportunities for youth and families, African-inspired goods, artist and delicious ethnic food.

<u>Christmas on Pine</u> – This event is about bringing the community together to celebrate the upcoming holiday season. Information about Kwanzaa will be provided along with holiday music, light food and refreshments and a visit from Santa Claus with gifts.

Leadership/Mentorship Workshops - This program will focus on today's youth and teens and how to transition them into tomorrow's leaders and responsible citizens. Fields trips will be included to expose youth and teens to higher institution of learning, technology centers, historical art and cultural sites.

Heritage & Cultural Programs

- African Dance Program -This program was developed for intercultural connectedness using African dance and has 2 components: 1) Project Based/Kuumba (which means creativity) students will learn and develop choreography with the ultimate goal being to perform at Groove City Culture Fest and for peers and parents. 2) Cultural and Fitness Education/Ujima (which means collective work and responsibility) students will learn about health benefits and cultural significance of African Dance. Using the principles intrinsic in African dance will provide students with the insight to become productive citizens in society.
- African Drum Program Students will learn to play traditional rhythms from Guinea West Africa, played on the djembe to perform at the Groove City Culture Fest. Emphasis will be placed on how drumming can benefit us in a multitude of ways, from stress reduction, improved focus, mindfulness, hand-eye coordination, and creating unity within a group. Students will learn the history, cultural significance, and traditions of the music and its people and leave with a solid feeling of rhythms from Guinea, West Africa. The drums are truly the call to community: They bring people together and energize and inspire us.

<u>Art Program</u> – This program will target youth, teens and families that are experiencing emotional and social trauma. Art therapy helps with self-expression, and the resulting artwork to help students understand their emotional conflicts, develop social skills, improve self-esteem, manage addictions, reduce anxiety, and restore normal function to their lives.
